Every year, girls begin Strong Women, Strong Girls (SWSG) by establishing standards and guidelines in a lesson called "Building a Strong Foundation." Over the past nine years, we have been building a similar foundation to create a brighter tomorrow for our girls across the nation.

As we prepare for our 10-year anniversary as a non-profit organization (we started informally in 2000, but incorporated as a 501c3 in 2004), we're reflecting on the pillars of SWSG's foundation that have made these nine years so strong. As SWSG's new President, I have been amazed at what we have accomplished so far:

- 9000+ Girls Served
- 3000+ College Mentors
- \$5,000,000+ Raised
- 3 States
- 60+ Communities
- 85% of our Participants Report Improvement in our Skill Set
- 85% of our Participants Report Alignment to our Values

While these results are exciting, they are only the beginning of our work. Long-time observers of the social sector field note that, as in the lives of our girls, year 10 is often an "anchor" year—the year in which an organization gains a deeper self-understanding, and grows more confident, strong, and impactful.
